I. Patient care activities

Summary score: exceeds

Director of the [REDACTED] laboratory. Has developed and is developing new assays. In the past year has brought up HIV processing for viral load, cardiac rejection testing and 16s rDNA gene sequencing. He has taken on more clinical responsibility with the departure of [REDACTED]

II. House staff teaching and administration

Summary score: meets

Does a significant amount of teaching of the residents while on they are on the [REDACTED] rotation.

Has instituted a weekly [REDACTED] didactic for the residents which have been well received. Gets good evaluations from the residents for his clinical and didactic teaching.

III. Student teaching

Summary score: exceeds

Teaches in case based learning with very good evaluations from the students. Also does a small group session in the [REDACTED] course- evaluations are below median. Has a masters student in his lab at the present time who should finish up her degree this spring.
